01 A Curriculum that Complies with International Standards

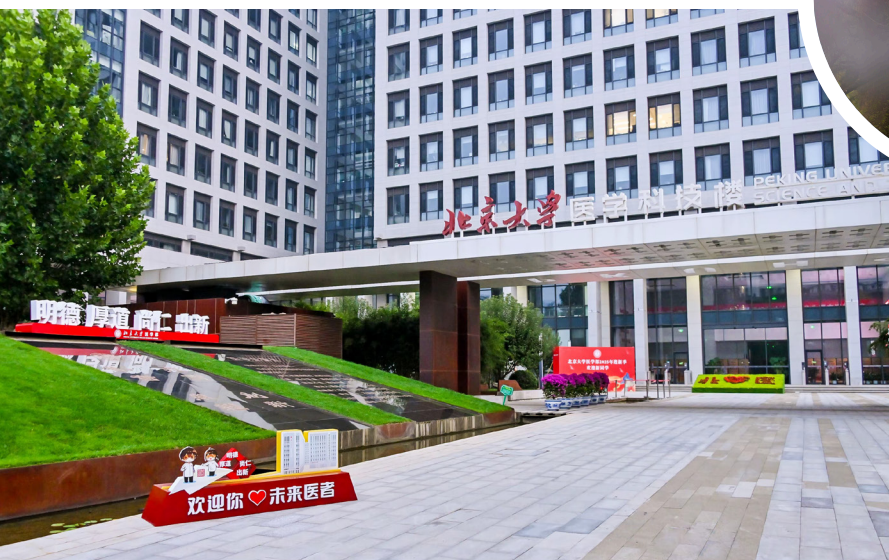

Faculty



Bernhard Schwartländer

Dr. Bernhard Schwartländer joined the Peking University Institute of Global Health and Development in March 2025 as Co-Chair of the Governing Board and Distinguished Research Professor of Global Health. From 2021 to 2025, he served as Global Health Envoy at the German Ministry of Foreign Affairs, contributing to global health diplomacy, pandemic preparedness, and multilateral cooperation. He previously held senior leadership roles at the World Health Organization, including Assistant Director-General and Chef de Cabinet at WHO headquarters, as well as WHO Representative in China. A medical doctor with a doctorate in medical epidemiology, he received professional training in Germany and at the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. His experience spans epidemiology, infectious disease control, health systems, international cooperation, and institutional leadership. At Peking University, he brings high-level practical experience to research, policy dialogue, institutional development, and the mentoring of future global health professionals.



Erasmus Morah

Dr. Erasmus U. Morah is an experienced United Nations leader who has served across Asia, Africa, and Europe for more than three decades. After twelve years with UNICEF in Pakistan, Eritrea, Somaliland, Somalia, and the Philippines, he joined UNAIDS in 2002. He has served as UNAIDS Country Director in Malawi, Kenya, South Africa, and Nigeria, and as Division Director at UNAIDS headquarters for Strategic Country and Regional Support and for Programme Planning, Budget, and Performance Measurement. At country level, he helped establish the first Joint UN Team on AIDS, supported UNAIDS/WHO policy development on HIV testing and counselling, pioneered mass HIV Testing Week, and contributed to the UNAIDS "Three Ones" principles. His work on "Modes of Transmission" analysis advanced more targeted HIV programming. Dr. Morah has supported major HIV countries in mobilizing substantial Global Fund resources and accelerating progress toward UNAIDS treatment targets. He holds degrees from the University of Alberta, Concordia University, and the University of British Columbia.



Hui Yin

Dr. Hui Yin is a lecturer in the Department of Global Health at the School of Public Health, Peking University, and an official consultant to the World Medical Association. She is also an adjunct research fellow at China Foreign Affairs University and previously served as a Tobacco-Free Initiative consultant at the WHO Representative Office in China. Her work focuses on global health governance and diplomacy, international health cooperation policy, regional and country studies, global health promotion, global health culture, competency, and talent development. Dr. Yin has led and participated in projects supported by the National Natural Science Foundation of China and international partners, and has published in Chinese and international academic journals. She has extensive experience in policy consultation and multilateral engagement. As an expert advisor to Chinese delegations, she has participated in the World Health Assembly, WHO Executive Board sessions, and WHO Regional Committee meetings, providing policy advice to institutions including the National Health Commission of China and WHO.



Jin Xu

Dr. Jin Xu is Associate Research Professor, Assistant Professor, and doctoral supervisor at the Peking University China Center for Health Development Studies. He works in health policy and systems research, with expertise in public health policy and health economics. He leads the Center for Integrated Health Systems Research and is a core member of the WHO Collaborating Centre for Universal Health Coverage and the National Health Commission Key Laboratory of Health System Reform and Governance. Dr. Xu received his Ph.D. in Public Health Policy from the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine under Professor Anne Mills. His research focuses on integrated care for chronic disease risk management, health service performance evaluation using health big data, and health financing policy evaluation. He has taught courses on health systems, health equity, hospital management, public health leadership, and health policy and systems research. Dr. Xu has led projects supported by national agencies, the China Medical Board, government ministries, and WHO-related initiatives, and has published widely in health policy and systems journals.



Minghui Ren

Professor Minghui Ren is Professor at the School of Public Health, Peking University, Dean of the Peking University Institute for Global Health, and Director of the Peking University China Center for Health Development Studies. He earned his Ph.D. from Xi'an Medical University (now Xi'an Jiaotong University Health Science Center), the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health, and Peking University. Since 1987, he has worked at the Ministry of Health and the National Health and Family Planning Commission, serving in senior roles including Director-General of the Department of International Cooperation. From January 2016 to November 2022, he served as Assistant Director-General of the World Health Organization, overseeing universal health coverage and the prevention and control of communicable and noncommunicable diseases. He has served on governing bodies of WHO, UNAIDS, and the Global Fund, and as Chinese lead representative on bilateral health cooperation committees with Russia, the United States, France, the United Kingdom, and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. He has received national honors from Russia and France.



Suerie Moon

Professor Suerie Moon is Professor of Practice in International Relations and Political Science at the Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies in Geneva, where she co-directs the Global Health Centre. A globally recognized scholar of global governance and health, she studies how international institutions, rules, and political processes shape health outcomes. Her empirical research focuses on equitable innovation and access to medicines, as well as the global governance of pandemics. Professor Moon's work is widely used by researchers, policymakers, and practitioners working on global health diplomacy, access to health technologies, and pandemic preparedness. She has published more than seventy peer-reviewed journal articles, fourteen book chapters, and numerous policy reports. She also conducts training and capacity-building activities on global health diplomacy and governance, advises governments and international organizations, and serves on expert committees. Professor Moon received a BA in history from Yale University, a master's degree in public affairs from Princeton University, and a Ph.D. in public policy from Harvard University.



Suwit Wibulpolprasert

Dr. Suwit Wibulpolprasert is a distinguished public health specialist, senior administrator, and policy advocate with extensive national and global experience. He began his career as a physician and director in rural Thailand, where he developed a lifelong commitment to equitable, community-based health services. Over more than three decades, he has held technical and administrative positions in the Thai Food and Drug Administration, the Bureau of Health Policy and Plan, the Ministry of Public Health, and senior disease control and health policy roles. He currently serves as Advisor to the Ministry of Public Health on global health and Vice Chair of the International Health Policy Program Foundation. Dr. Suwit has contributed to Thailand's health system development from grassroots service delivery to national reform. He is widely recognized as an advocate for pro-poor health policies and public-interest protection in global health. His work emphasizes that equitable, inclusive, and fair health systems require strong primary health care, committed health personnel, and a public-service spirit.



Xiaojun Liang

Dr. Xiaojun Liang is an associate professor in the Department of Diplomacy and Foreign Affairs Management at China Foreign Affairs University. She joined the university in 2006 and has served as Director of the Teaching and Research Office of Diplomacy and Deputy Director of the Department of Diplomacy. She received her Ph.D. in Law from the School of International Studies at Peking University, following a master's degree and bachelor's degree from Peking University. She has held visiting scholar appointments at the London School of Economics and Political Science, American University, the Institute for Security and Development Policy in Sweden, and Bond University in Australia. Her research focuses on international negotiation, diplomatic decision-making, foreign policy analysis, national image, political culture, and European affairs. Dr. Liang has published on British Euroscepticism, British European policy, diplomatic negotiation strategies, Zhou Enlai's cultural diplomacy, and political identity. She is author of a monograph on Britain's European policy, translator of *Democracy and Dictatorship*, and co-author of *Sixteen Lectures on Contemporary Chinese Diplomacy*.



Xiaolin Wei

Professor Xiaolin Wei is a tenured full professor of Global Health Policy at the Dalla Lana School of Public Health, University of Toronto, and Director of the Centre for Global Implementation Research. He leads the school's interdisciplinary implementation research working group and serves as China liaison, coordinating collaboration with partners in Asia. His research focuses on global health policy, health systems, implementation science, and infectious disease control, with attention to translating evidence into effective public health practice and policy. As principal investigator, he has led major projects funded by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research, the UK Department for International Development, the Medical Research Council, WHO, and the Hong Kong Research Grants Council. He has advised WHO and the Stop TB Partnership and holds visiting professorships at universities in China and the United Kingdom. Professor Wei has published more than 120 SCI-indexed papers, including articles in *The Lancet*, and reviews for leading journals such as *The BMJ*, *Bulletin of the World Health Organization*, *Health Policy and Planning*, *PLOS ONE*, and *PLOS Medicine*.



Yangmu Huang

Dr. Yangmu Huang is a tenured associate professor and Deputy Director of the Department of Global Health at the School of Public Health, Peking University. She is also an adjunct researcher at the Institute for Global Health and Development, Peking University, and has been a visiting scholar at the Institute of Development Studies. Her research covers global health governance, research and development for global health, nutrition and food safety, and health emergency preparedness and response, with a consistent focus on health equity. She is particularly interested in how research, development, and access to public goods can better serve vulnerable populations. Dr. Huang has led more than thirty research grants supported by the National Natural Science Foundation of China, national ministries, and United Nations agencies, and has been selected for China's National Young Talent Program. She has authored or co-authored over eighty scientific publications, including papers in *The Lancet* and *The BMJ*. She also advises Chinese ministries and international organizations including WHO, UNICEF, and the Gates Foundation.



Yinzi Jin

Dr. Yinzi Jin is Associate Director of the Department of Global Health at the School of Public Health, Peking University, where she serves as a research professor and doctoral supervisor. Her work focuses on global health governance and international development cooperation, especially health system strengthening, universal health coverage, and evidence-informed policy innovation. In recent years, she has led or coordinated more than ten projects supported by the National Natural Science Foundation of China, the Beijing Natural Science Foundation, the China Medical Board, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, and other funders. Her cooperation work has covered ASEAN countries, the Shanghai Cooperation Organization region, West Africa, and Belt and Road countries, addressing service integration, digital technology, health financing, and intervention evaluation. Dr. Jin has published more than seventy papers as first or corresponding author and contributed to several global health books. She also serves in international networks and advisory platforms, including Health Systems Global, the Association of Pacific Rim Universities Global Health Program, and Chinese delegations to WHO and G20 health meetings.
